

Judge's Comments

R Crowe

- 1st #15 This very balanced cow winning the class shows strength, dairyness along with refinement. She places over #6 for her more secure foreudder attachment, height of rear udder and is showing a desirable tail setting.
- 2nd #6 #6 placing over #3, she is clearly displaying more dairyness throughout, especially her refined thigh and flatter bone in her hock.
- 3rd #3 #3 over #2 is showing more breed character in her head with a longer, cleaner neck. This cow also has more texture and blending through her foreudder.
- 4th #2 #2 over #4. This cow is overpowering #4 with her capacity throughout depth of chest and mid-section. This is giving her this advantage.
- 5th #4 #4 places over #16. This placing shows a refined youthful cow that has an advantage through her dairyness.
- 6th #16 A great bodied cow not quite showing the same refinement as cows above her.

S Cunliffe

- 1st #2 Shows great dairy strength and capacity. High wide rear udder with a strongly attached foreudder. Powerful yet balanced cow.
- 2nd #6 Beautiful, angular cleaned boned cow. Sweep of rib and lovely textured mammary.
- 3rd #4 Hard topped dairy cow. Clean through the legs with a wide rear udder and longer foreudder.
- 4th #15 Great read udder height and width. Strong muzzle.
- 5th #16 Another capacious depth through the forerib. Correct rump angle.
- 6th #3 Silky black cow. Long and angular with a well textured udder.

B Leslie

A mighty class of Mature Cows, indeed a great credit to all involved.

My 1st cow (#16) to me puts it all together with such wonderful balance throughout, she has an advantage over this ultra dairy cow in 2nd (#3) being that bit snugger of her udder. My 2nd cow (#3) goes over 3rd (#2) being a little longer and evidence of more dairy character. 3rd (#2) gives me greater depth of frame than 4th (#4) who is more shallow of her udder than 5th (#6) who in a close placing places over 6th (#15) on her incredible capacity.

I really found this a magnificent class.

D Pipe (Tie Judge)


- 3rd #3 She has a distinct advantage on the blending of her foreudder. She also appears to be cleaner in the neck and brisket.



Judge's Comments

R Crowe

- 1st #34 A clear winner for me, she is a young cow excelling in length with strength, dairyness and a great udder. She has the making of a super dairy cow. She places over #27, showing more capacity, bone quality and a higher, wider rear udder.
- 2nd #27 #27 placing over #30. This cow is showing a little more length throughout her body, and mo0re refinement down throughout her neck, shoulder, and brisket.
- 3rd #30 #30 placing over #28. Both are nice, bodied cows, but I am giving the advantage to #30 throughout her mammary displaying capacity and blending in her foreudder and more height in her rear udder.
- 4th #28 #28 placing over #37 for her blending of body parts. She is a very balanced cow with an advantage over her rump and tail setting.
- 5th #37 #37 placing over #32 for her overall capacity throughout, width of chest and depth of both fore and rear rib.
- 6th #32 Nice uddered young cow, but not quite showing the same capacity as others above her. \

S Cunliffe

- 1st #28 Stunning angular, capacious cow. Well attached and textured udder. Clean boned.
- 2nd #34 Superior bone quality. Angular frame, cleaner legs and a longer and more firmly attached foreudder.
- 3rd #37 Large capacity Dairy Cow, plenty of strength and depth.
- 4th #30 Well textured udder. Long and great length throughout.
- 5th #32 Lovely textured and well attached foreudder. Strong topline.
- 6th #27 Good slope to the rump. Nice sweep to her long ribs. Clean through the shoulders.

B Leslie

What a tremendous group of Intermediate cows.

I just love this 1st cow (#34), dairyness, power and an exceptional udder, a great young cow indeed. She goes over 2nd (#32) on her tremendous length. 2nd (#32) over this great young dark cow in 3rd (#28) with her dairyness, 3rd (#28) over 4th (#30) using her width throughout. 4th (#30) over 5th (#27) due to her tremendous udder while my 5th (#27) cow uses her terrific dairy character to place over the cow in 6th (#37).

D Pipe (Tie Judge)

4th #32 – I give her a clear advantage in capacity and depth of chest. She blends better in her foreudder and has more length to her rump over #27.



R Crowe

- 1st #51 A very nice well balanced two-year-old winning this class. She places over #55 for showing more quality and blending throughout. She has a little more quality in her mammary with more texture bloom and width in her rear udder.
- 2nd #55 #55 placing over #48 with her advantage in the dairyness through her front end and showing more refinement from her neck through into her brisket.
- 3rd #48 #48 placing over #45 for her capacity displaying more depth in her chest and more fore and rear rib.
- 4th #45 #45 placing over #47 for the advantage in her foreudder attachment being firmer and more attached. Also, for the height of her rear udder attachment.
- 5th #47 #47 placing over #49 excelling in her open dairy frame starting through her head blending down through her neck with more depth through her chest and fore rib.
- 6th #49 Nice two-year-old showing texture and capacity in her mammary.

S Cunliffe

- 1st #47 Depth of rib, clean angular bone, great leg set. Clean through the shoulders and neck.
- 2nd #51 Well balanced, well textured udder. Clean head and neck.
- 3rd #48 Strong cow with a hard topline. Nice height to the rear udder.
- 4th #49 Long cow with a great foreudder.
- 5th #45 Strength of topline. Strong muzzle length through the chest.
- 6th #55 A cow with a lot of strength, well balanced.

B Leslie

This Junior Cow class is just full of wonderful young cows right through.


A wonderful young cow in 1st (#49) for me, so open, framey, dairy with super quality udder, it's her overall capacity and milkiness that place her on top for me. 2nd (#45) looks to be wider and uses her terrific udder to place over 3rd (#55). My 3rd cow (#55) is more shallow of her udder and has more style than my 4th cow (#47) while this 4th cow (#47) is more correct of her leg set than the young red cow in 5th (#51) who is more dairy than the capacious cow in 6th (#48).

D Pipe (Tie Judge)

- 3rd #45 She shows more balance throughout her frame and especially in her udder. To go over #49.
- 4th #49 I give her the advantage of bloom to her udder and texture of udder.



Judge's Comments

R Crowe

- 1st #64 For this yearling class, #64 is a clear winner. A very well-balanced heifer from the tip of her nose to her tail. She has the advantage over #62 for her length of body, dairyness, and the quality through her front end.
- 2nd #62 #62 places over #66 for the advantage in dairyness and the more desirable blending through her neck and brisket, also her refinement through her thigh and rear leg.
- 3rd #66 #66 places over #59. Both similar heifers but the advantage for me is the breed character through her head and the depth of her mid-section.
- 4th #59 #59 places over #58 for her refinement in her brisket. This pair is a close placing.
- 5th #58 #58 placing over #60 displaying more length of neck following down through with length of body.
- 6th #60 Nice heifer in 6th. Heifers placed above her are just showing a little more scope and dairyness.

S Cunliffe

- 1st #66 Stunning Heifer. Hugely capacious. Deep open rib, yet still clean bound and defined.
- 2nd #58 Long dairy Heifer. Hard topline. Capacious and clean throughout the neck and head.
- 3rd #60 Another deep Heifer with a great set to the rear legs.
- 4th #59 Angular heifer who blends smoothly throughout. A more superior rear leg set than the 5th placed Heifer.
- 5th #64 Long smooth blending Heifer, with a better leg angle when viewed from the side.
- 6th #62 Silky black Heifer, with a great slope to the rump.

B Leslie

Simply a beautiful heifer (#60) on top for me in the Yearling class, I admire her great balance of dairyness and strength, to me her spring of rib and openness place her over 2nd (#58) who is longer through her neck and deeper of her rear rib and flank than 3rd (#59). My 3rd (#59) heifer blends so much nicer from shoulder to neck and looks more correct in her rear leg set than 4th (#64). It's the length of frame that places 4th (#64) over 5th (#62) while I prefer the dairy character of the 5th heifer (#62) over 6th (#66) who displays great substance.

D Pipe (Tie Judge)

- 2nd #64 I give her the advantage in overall cleanness of bone, length of neck and more correct pin setting.
- 3rd #66 I give her the advantage in length of frame and bone quality in the hock.
- 4th #60 A heifer with lots of power through the front and depth of chest.

Judge's Comments

R Crowe

- 1st #80 A lovely balanced black heifer to win this class, I give her the advantage over #85 in showing more strength and depth through her chest. She also has more length and is more refined in her thigh with a cleaner bone in her rear leg.
- 2nd #85 #85 placing over #81 for her overall dairyness. She is showing a cleaner, sharper bone throughout.
- 3rd #81 #81 placing over #71 showing more length of neck and a bit fuller through her crops with more length of fore rib.
- 4th #71 #71 places over #67 with an advantage through her mdi section showing a nicer sweep and openness through her ribs. Also displaying a cleaner thigh.
- 5th #67 #67 places over #82 with a slight advantage given through her front end with that refinement following through her shoulder and mid-section.
- 6th #82 This is a very good black heifer but lacking the dairy quality to place higher in this class.

S Cunliffe

- 1st #80 Stylish Heifer. Great length of rib and forerib, deep and capacious. Balanced Heifer.
- 2nd #71 Length and cleanliness of bone. Refinement of legs, strength, and top bone.
- 3rd #82 Clean and angular Heifer with a more correct rump set.
- 4th #81 More length and sweep of rib. Stronger topline.
- 5th #85 Longer and cleaner especially through the shoulders and neck.
- 6th #67 Strong Heifer with plenty of capacity.

B Leslie

This huge calf class was full of exceptional entries.

I thought my 1st heifer (#85) really pulled it all together, she has frame, dairyness, substance and great balance. In a close placing I prefer her length and style over 2nd (#81). I like the width throughout of 2nd (#81) over 3rd (#67) while 3rd (#67) uses her cleaness throughout over 4th (#80). This 4th (#80) heifer goes over 5th (#71) on her depth of fore rib while I prefer the dairy character of my 5th (#71) over 6th (#82).
